Our theme for March will be animals of all kinds: our favorite pets, different animals from all over the world, and even worms and germs! We are expanding our vocabulary and will start learning how to recognize, spell, and write the names of different animals.

The Sequoias are currently most interested in pandas and worms. This month we will be using this excitement to springboard some investigations about what a worm eats, and what the word decompose means. We will be collecting some worms, dirt, and other materials from the wetlands to track the progress of how worms can decompose things at different speeds in our compost viewer!

We would also like to remind parents and caregivers to check their child's art cubby when picking up or dropping them off. We do our best to send children home with their artwork, but we have gotten behind. Some things also don't do very well in full backpacks. Each child has an art cubby with their name on it in the art center. We need more room new projects!
