



Sequoia Room

We are moving forward with our exploration of machinery and construction. The kids have loved building with our big blocks and making structures from sticks in the wetlands, building train tracks and roads, and pulling friends and materials in our cars (wagons). We will look at the machinery involved in transporting materials and constructing large buildings, such as cranes, trucks, trains, while also looking through history at simple machines and how they have evolved over time.

There is also lots of themes carrying over from spring and the outdoors. We'll look further at growth and how the plants and weather change with the seasons, while beginning to explore sustainability and positive ways to care for the environment.

We've been exploring:

The kids are having lots of fun digging and playing with natural materials. Activities have included making mud pies, building small villages in the dirt, planting seeds and incorporating natural materials into art projects.

We've also been taking a scientific look at some natural phenomena, such as what makes it rain, how volcanoes are made and work, and the different cycles of nature.

Looking forward to:

In our exploration of machinery and construction we will be making simple machines and understanding their functions. We'll also be looking at how machines have evolved and what methods have been used throughout history to transport materials and create buildings. There will also be a variety of science projects looking at load-bearing structures and the evolution of transportation.

As we continue to work on our garden beds we will also look further at sustainability. How do we care for the environment? Why do we recycle and compost? We will explore this through readings, discussion, and our compost observation station, comparing how different materials decompose.
